Matchday is not separate from this approach — it's an extension of training. We don't treat matches as something bigger or more pressurised. They are simply another chance to learn, to try things, to make mistakes, and to grow. When a coach approaches matchday with the mindset that *"we're all here to learn today"*, that attitude passes to the players — and everyone benefits.
